## **From the Principal's Desk**

As we learn about our Patriarchs and Matriarchs, we see the actions they did, the effort they put forth, and the tests they overcame. Hashem has given us the privilege to see what goes into the make up of the Jewish neshama.

When the Torah describes the life of Sarah, it breaks it into 3 periods- One Hundred, and twenty, and seven years. Rashi describes that each period builds on the next until its completion, showing us how pure Sarah was and giving us the perspective to look at the building blocks that go into creating a fulfilling life.

Rashi describes the first period as a stage of beauty. Beauty is something that captures a complete picture. Seeing the whole child, watching their personalities develop, helping them to build their independence, their confidence, and encouraging them to explore and think deeper is the beauty of Ohr Chadash. The students of Ohr Chadash are living what Rashi calls beauty. The school is constantly developing and learning new ideas, implementing new ways to reach our students, growing and expanding ourselves as we work to move to the next level.

In an article published by [Education Weekly](#), it talks about the common core state standards for math and the misconceptions that people have about how the common core is implemented. It states, "*the common standards for math differ from most previous state standards in significant ways. They are fewer in number, connect more broadly across grade levels, and emphasize conceptual understanding along with the procedural skills that schools have traditionally taught.*"

But, the distinction between what students should know by the end of the year (standards) and the specifics of how they should learn it (curriculum), can be blurry, because they are essentially two different things. Here at Ohr Chadash, we are fortunate to have a curricula that provides the framework for what our students should be learning and even more fortunate to have excellent teachers who can teach the curricula so that everyone can learn!


# Kindergarten




These reading groups read short stories that reinforced the comprehension element, problem and solution, and the students also worked to refine their use of the

comprehension strategy, “check for understanding.” The two reading groups that met this week read stories that had very different topics, but contained one central theme.



One reading group read about a family that gets chosen to participate on a family game show. Each member of the family wants to participate for different reasons, but each feels nervous or anxious about one part of the game. How would you solve this problem if your family were in this position? In the other story, a game of Little League is going downhill when the pitcher is suspected of cheating. How would you handle being a part of this game? Would you try and stop the cheating? Would you



have a different opinion based on whether you’re on the winning team or losing team? Thinking about how you would solve problems can help you understand a story and its characters better!

# Science Class

In their science class, the third graders are building Rube Goldberg machines. They learned about simple machines and cause and effect, and combined those ideas to complete a common goal – build a three to five step machine that knocks down an Obi Wan Kenobi action figure placed in the middle of the lab. There are pulleys hanging from the ceiling, bins of dominos that are waiting to be set up, and an impressive amount of teamwork shown from the third grade! Each group had to first review simple machines, form a hypothesis and draw a blueprint before they were able to start building. The machines will be put to the test on Monday.



Grades four and five are also innovating. They have been learning Newton's three laws of motion, and are testing out the third law: every action has an equal and opposite reaction. Their tools are balloons, straws, and yarn. Their goal is design an air powered balloon rocket that will go across the room. By blowing up and then releasing the balloon, they are able to observe the reaction caused by the escaping air. Using a combination of research and trial and error, each team was able to launch a successful rocket across the lab.



Grades K – 2 have started learning about weather and climate. Kindergarten took a poll to see which weather pattern was everyone's favorite. It came as no surprise that everyone loves snow days! First grade is working on identifying weather patterns to see what effects the weather has on our environment. Second grade is also looking at our environment, but are studying how wind and water shape the land. Everyone, without exception, is sorry to see the end of the warm weather!
